Most of these estimates draw on a projection of where we will be after evidence for about 150 "trunk" documents falls due on July 2, so a fair amount of guesswork is involved. We may have assassination record designations from the FBI's file for its liaison with the Secret Service. I suggest that you and I go over this with Joan upon her return next week. (Also, for some time, the records culled by Michelle and me from the FBI's administrative files for the Mexico City legat have been awaiting your review to finalize a staff recommendation although I think there is a good chance that we could get the FBI to agree to process the identified records from these files without a Board-level formal designation.) The FBI has generally complied with outstanding additional-information-and-evidence requests, with the exception of the informal request for intercontinental electronic intercepts. There has been some effort by the Task Force to identify the relevant source files (involving several symbol numbers), but as yet no material has been made available for us to review. I will check the status of other requests and pass on any problems identified.By way of future requests, I'd suggest the HQ file on LBJ and ways of getting at information provided by NSA to the FBI (since the liaison file apparently does not contain substantive information).
