One of the worthwhile things Eric and I brought back from our perusal of the Warren Papers at the Library of Congress was the most comprehensive listing I have ever come across of WC employees (addresses, titles, etc.). On this listing, Julia Eide (someone Dave is already looking for) was styled "Administrative Assistant to General Counsel" (as opposed to "Secretary"), which suggests to me that we are doing the right thing in expending some of Dave's valuable time in looking for her. Similarly, the list contains the names of two individuals -- previously unknown to me -- who bear the job title of "Records Clerk" (one was a detailee from NARA, the other from DOD). While ambivalent about how far we can profitably take this 9/18 meeting investigation, it occurs to me that records clerks could be relevant folks to talk to, if we can find them. Please advise as to whether or not you think this something Dave might be tasked to undertake. I'm not necessarily advocating it, but I thought I should ask the question.
