Re: Request Dear Wil. Gilliti. This is in response to your e-mail dated september 10, 1330.First, contemporarieous with early groups of documents released by the Review Board, (that were small in numbers), we were able to send out copies of documents upon request. However, with the increase in the number of documents being released and the increase in our work in general, we no longer have the capabilities to send out documents. With the exception of a few small number of documents, we stopped the practice after the first of this year. We do not even have on hand copies of all the documents released by the Board and sent to the National Archives. Thus, requests for documents should go through the National Archives. Second and similarly, requests for documents related to the planning and protection of the motorcade should go to the National Archives. A quick search of the HSCA records database showed that Document Number 180-10105-10411 is identified as a "Deposition of Jerry Bruno," 57 pages in length and dated 8/18/78. The document is identified as being open in full. Third, although the Military Records Team is actively pursuing assassination records, there is no specific progress on the Oswald military intelligence file destruction to report at this time.Sincerely,Thomas E.
