I would, however, make a pitch to keep 3 names on the ELSUR list: Alderisio, Braden, and Butler. Each one has received attention from Peter Dale Scott that suggests more than passing interest. I would also offer up a name of an individual deleted in an earlier discussion: Paulo Sierra Martinez. Martinez was a Chicago lawyer who was the head of JGCE (Junta del Gobierno de Cuba en Exilio), which was mob-financed according to Peter Dale Scott. Martinez had the backing of Robert Kennedy.
