Subject: Re: Forensics update

My review and listing of the various forensics tests has been stalled, as a result of other projects, however it has not fallen from my radar screen. Currently, I am at the review of Warren commission testimony and the Edgewood arsenal lab tests on Mannlicher Carcano wound ballistics. I went through commission testimony of Frazier, Simmons and Nichol and noted them in the ballistics spreadsheet. In addition, I have gone through the testimony of Dr. Dziemian and Dr. Oliver, both from the Edgewood Arsenal, although I have not placed their tests within the spreadsheet. I also read the final report of the HSCA firearm examination panel. What needs to be completed is the following: 1) Final review of the Warren Commission testimony of Ballistics witnesses. 2) HSCA Testimony of Ballistics witnesses. 3) Accountability of the reports and tests conducted by both WC and HSCA at the National Archives. 4) Following accountability, determine where records are and who should be spoken/deposed in order to find remaining records. Depending on the schedule of the military team declassification project, which may be delayed, then I would suggest going with the four week time frame. If we move ahead as previously planned then it may require extensive out of office time and internal document review which could delay the forensic/ballistic project.
