Griffith. Michael just answered me and suggested I contact you. While awaiting to hear from Michael I spoke to Gary (Mack?) at the Texas School Book Depository Museum and also to Col Fletcher Prouty's Webmaster. I couldn't find anyone else I recognized as a credible and truthful researcher. I am not looking for any monetary reward, so I said nothing to the media. This information I am about to tell you may or may not be of value to your organization. I don't know if I was told the truth or not, but I do know it happened. Several times. So that I don't have to retype it all over again, I am going to copy the Email I sent to Prouty's Website for you to take into consideration. Here it is:------From: Frank W. I had a experience in the early 90's (before Oliver Stone's movie came out) that has bothered me ever since. I spoke with Gary at the Texas School Book Depository museum yesterday and ran down what I am about to say here and he felt it was bullshit. He may, or may not be right. For what it's worth, here it is: I work at Kelly AFB here in San Antonio, I've been there for 15 years, working in Supply, Personnel, Maintenance and, since 1989, at the Air Terminal where the Air Force ships anything and everything to other Air Force Bases around the world. In the early 90's the terminal cut back on the use of commercial planes to ship cargo, and two of the bases we shipped cargo to, Dyess and Carswell, began to use trucks. A contract trucking company, TSMT, started making daily runs to and from their bases to ours. One evening (2nd shift) a driver named Jerry told us that in 1963 he was a photographer for the Army and he and 2 other photographers were sent to Dealy Plaza to film the President. Jerry told us he was up on a railroad overpass with a tripod and sound recording film equipment, as were the other 2 in his entourage. He told us that between the 3 they captured the entire assassination, and following the event, a federal agent tried to confiscate his film equipment and his lieutenant pulled his pistol on the man.
