Mohr if it has been probated. The reason for getting the will is to see if he identifies any papers that he left with anyone in particular. Mr. Mohr lived in Arlington so perhaps the will has been probated in the Arlington County courts. Second, I would like to obtain the address and phone number for the wife (if alive) and children of William C. Sullivan, who was the head of the Domestic Intelligence Division at the FBI. The HSCA and Curt Gentry both indicate that Sullivan had records in his personal custody. I can show you some of the papers regarding him that I located in the HSCA files. Third, with respect to Tolson, I would hold off on obtaining the will. Certain provisions of the will and codicils are quoted in the Curt Gentry book on Hoover. The will was the subject of a lawsuit in Superior Court in the District of Columbia -- Tolson v. Mohr, No. 868-75. At this point, I am not certain that it is worth the time to review those court papers so I would hold off for now. (Question for you Dave, Jeremy, and Laura -- In a will dispute, is an inventory done of the estate? what I am getting at is whether there would be any prospect of finding anything in the Tolson case file that would have inventoried the estate including any papers of Tolson). In sum, I would make obtaining the Mohr will (if there is one) your first priority. Thanks. Ron Record
