Dan:I hope by now you have received the entire press release (if not, please let me know.)The significance of these papers lies in the fact that the JFK Collection at NARA has been enriched. Clay Shaw was the only person ever prosecuted for the assassination of President Kennedy, and this important part of the "assassination puzzle" now has more pieces.The papers need to be processed by the Archives staff, and they will then be available to the public at the National Archives. There are seven boxes of material (the boxes are all approximately the size of a paper box) and they contain Shaw's diary that he kept during the trial, and records from his criminal case, to name a few.Although I cannot give you an exact date of when the Shaw papers will be available to the public, it is a priority and I do not think it will be too much longer.I hope this answers your questions.
