Subject: Re: Monthly Report to Congress -- Compliance

Tom--We told the following agencies that they were essentially done under the JFK Act: Army's Criminal Investigative Command, Army's Central Security Facility, Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, ATF, Civil Rights Division of DOJ, Postal Service. There may be some document processing issues that remain, but as far as record searches we told these agencies that no further record searches were required unless we learned of other specific records that they should have. We told two agencies that they had not completed their work: Bethesda Naval Hospital -- We were not satisfied that the Final Declaration of Compliance had adequately accounted for the files of the top officials at Bethesda Naval Hosp. for the 1963-64 period. We requested a suppl. declaration on this point. White House Communications Agency -- Their Final Declaration said they had no records identifying or indicating the disposition of any of their 1963-64 records. Nor did they have any records from that period. We asked for an interview. We had the interview but still have received no information as to what records there are from 1963-64. We have now simply asked the WHCA to state explicitly under oath that they have no records from this time period and, if possible, to confirm whether the records were sent to the Presidential libraies (it appears that some WHCA materials may have gone to the Johnson Library). Let me know if you want to look at any of the underlying correspondence.--Ron
