Doug, I just received a call from the Army Declassification Activity and they are having a case of buyer's remorse over the release of the Pfuntner document, RIF # 198-10004-10015. None of their declassifiers are in the office because of the holidays. The woman who called left her name and a message on your machine. The woman who called from Jack Matthews office wanted to know if the document had been released to the public. I said that it had been sent to NARA in the middle of November for public release after being declassified in Oct.. I stated that the Army declassifiers did not identify any recommended redactions and that I thought you had asked Capt. Bircher about this release. I also explained that if the Army declassifiers had identified something that they had wanted withheld, that they would have to make a case for postponement in accordance with the JFK Act, and that our Board would not be inclined to postpone this name unless the Army presented some evidence. She wanted to know as much as possible about Mr. Pfuntner and whether he had been notified of the release of his name. I told her that we had attempted to contact Mr. Pfuntner, but were not successful. Jim
