There is a 2/3/75 FBI document and attached 1/31/75 Washington Star News article which indicates that Tommy Boggs was in possession on these dates of 30 pages of WC material given to him by his father. These 30 pages consisted of dossiers compiled by the FBI on various WC critics, notably Mark Lane. The article cites Tommy Boggs as indicating that he was keeping the documents in a safe deposit box along with other Congressional papers of his late father. This revelation appears to have been made in conjunction w/the hearings of Congressman Don Edwards' Judiciary Committee subcommittee on Human and Constitutional Rights. I've left the hardcopy of the FBI document and article with Laura and Kevin. I know Lindsey Boggs has been very cooperative and supportive of the Board's work, but we thought we'd pass this on in case the above-referenced documents are still outstanding.
