Hi Eileen --The number of "already-identified" records that still need to be reviewed is not really easy to figure out, and would take me 4-5 hours to even do an approximation. I wouldn't be able to focus on it until after the experts leave next Tuesday, but here's what I can tell you right now --*We have something like 100,000 pages of HSCA subjects left to be reviewed. *I do not know the number of core files that have outstanding issues -- but you can report to Mr. Galanor that, in the core files, the overwhelming majority of documents that haven't been voted on yet are documents that contain foreign government information and grand jury information (records under seal). *Requests for Additional Information. Of those requests that we have reviewed, the FBI is processing about 15,000 pages. We still need to review a LOT of files that we have requested in our requests for additional information, but I do not expect to locate more than 500 or so assassination records in these files. *Misc. We are currently reviewing a 43,000 page record group that comprises the FBI's working files on HSCA. We still need to review a very large (page numbers unknown) file that is the FBI's administrative files on the JFK Act. Bob Freeman is finishing the review of the Church, Pike, and Rockefeller Committee files -- page numbers unknown. Let me know if you have any questions.
