If you accidentally delete something at home, try the following procedure:
1) Go to the MS-DOS prompt. It's in the Main group in Program Manager.
2) Go to the directory where the file you deleted was. In case you've forgotten, the following commands move you around in DOS:
Cd .. Go to the directory level above the current one
Cd .. Go to the directory level above the current one
3) Type "Undelete"
This may bring up the most recently deleted files in the directory you're currently in. However, I forget whether undelete looks in the current directory for deleted files, or if you have to specifically tell it where to look. If this is the case, try typing the directory path after Undelete (i.e., undelete c:\office\wpwin\wpdocs\). You may also need to type *.* after the path (i.e., undelete c:\office\wpwin\wpdocs*.*)
