The ARRB may, of course, be aware of the issue but if not, it should be as it is one of profound import. An individual named John Armstrong of Tulsa, Oklahoma, is working on a theory that there were two nearly identical persons using the name of Lee Harvey Oswald. One bit of information he uses to support this allegation revolves around three W-2 tax forms now at the National Archives in the name of Lee Harvey Oswald, one of which is from Pfisterer Dental Labs where Oswald was employed in 1956. The taxpayer ID number near the top of the form is (according to information provided by Armstrong in a JFK newsgroup posting) 72-0444599. The post goes on to say that the current owner of Pfisterer Labs, Linda Faircloth, wrote to the IRS concerning the tax number in 1995. The IRS responded by saying there was no record of this number. However, several numbers from the same sequence were established in January, 1964; therefore, Oswald's number probably was as well. Armstrong has used this to say that the numbers are forged since they were established in 1964 when Oswald was already dead and not 1956. Is there an easy way for the ARRB to definitively put an end to this allegation? I think this is the type of thing that can gain a life of its own if it is not dealt with promptly. Perhaps the ARRB through its dealings with the IRS can settle the issue once and for all, or in fact, is now working to do so.
