 Ms. Sullivan, I would like to inquire if you received my message of 5 June 98 (reproduced below) and if the ARRB is considering acting on it. I believe the Trembley photos, for the reasons I outlined in my message, are important assassination-related evidence, and they certainly fall within the purview of the ARRB's mandate. I look forward to hearing from you. Thanks for your time. Mike Griffith  
 Ms. Sullivan, >> Has the ARRB asked the FBI to release the Trembley photographs? >> U.S. Customs officer Jean Paul Trembley, working in Montreal at the time, reported soon after the > assassination that he had seen Lee Harvey Oswald handing out Fair Play for Cuba pamphlets in > Montreal in August 1963. Trembley, who was working on cases involving Cubans, took one of the > handbills from the man he later identified as Oswald. Trembley said two men and a woman were > working with Oswald. >> PHOTOS WERE TAKEN OF THE PERSON TREMBLEY BELIEVED WAS OSWALD, and as of 1984 > the FBI had possession of these photos but still refused to release them. To my knowledge, the > photos > are still in the possession of the FBI. >> The photos will either confirm it was Oswald or show it was not. Equally importantly, if not more so, the > photos could provide us with a picture of an Oswald impersonator and of persons who were working > with him. The real Oswald was reportedly in New Orleans at the time Trembley saw "Oswald" in > Montreal. >> Could you please tell me if the ARRB has asked the FBI to release the Trembley photos? If not, I > believe the board should do so, since these photos are important evidence. >> Mike Griffith
