This material has been transferred to the JFK > Collection at the National Archives. >> The Assassination Records Review Board was established by the JFK Act, > which was signed into law by President George Bush. The five members of > the Board were > appointed by President Clinton, confirmed by the U.S. Senate, and sworn in > on April > 11, 1994. The law gives the Review Board the mandate and the authority to > identify, secure, and make available all records related to the > assassination of President Kennedy. It is the responsibility of the Board > to determine which records are to be made public immediately and which ones > will have postponed release dates. >> The Review Board consists of the following members: >> Honorable John R.
