I spoke with both Mike Gillette of Legislative Archives and Steve Tilley about the Holocaust Assets Commission, and they both referred me to Greg Bradsher of the Civil Reference Division of the National Archives, as the Archives expert on the Nazi Gold issue. I also spoke with him, and he did not have much to add to our current knowledge, but the following: 1) Sen. Boxer and Sen. D'Amato are commissioners; 2) they have a budget of 3.5 million that has to be spent by the end of the calendar year 1999; 3) Solarz is the Chair, and he has been working in D.C. as a lobbyist since leaving the House; and 4) Bradsher thinks that the Commission will be physically located within the State Department Building. Bradsher also mentioned that an acquaintance of his wants to be the Executive Director, but he doubts that the acquaintance will actually get the job.
