Dear Mr. Coyle,

This letter is to confirm our scheduled meeting with you at your home on Tuesday, October 15, 1996, at 11:00 a.m. As during our earlier phone interview, during this meeting I will again ask you to describe your duties and experiences as a member of the Army's 112th INTC Group. I will tape the interview, and I will ask you at the outset to swear on tape that your account is true to the best of your recollection. (The only purpose in doing this is to assure assassination researchers that this is not a "cooked" interview in any way, but rather exactly what it is: a candid statement of your remembrances.)

I will be bringing various archival documents for you to look at. Our goal in doing this is to see if any of these jog your memory. Additionally, you may be able to help us fill in some gaps in our knowledge about the organization and operations of the 112th's Dallas office.

I am enclosing a copy of the transcript of our telephone conversation with you on July 29, 1996. Please accept my apologies for the delay in getting it to you. It had to be submitted to our General Counsel for approval; in addition, several developments in the last few weeks have required the full attention of the military team. Unfortunately, your transcript, which we promised you, was delayed. I regret the lapse in fulfilling that promise.

I will also be bringing excerpts from several books and articles where assassination researchers have written about you and/or your duties. I think you will find these interesting. On the advice of our General Counsel, I think it best that I not show you any of these excerpts until we actually do our interview. (That way, no one will ever be able to say later that your recollections were influenced, one way or another, by what various authors may already have written.)
