

*ASSASSINATION RECORDS REVIEW BOARD

**Background:** In late May of 1996, a previously little-known film came to the attention of the ARRB. This film was shot by a cameraman from a Dallas TV station on November 22, 1963, who had been covering President Kennedy's visit. This film was 45 minutes in length, and consisted of outtakes and unused footage from the entire day's events. While it did not show the shooting itself, it did capture the immediate aftermath of the shooting, as well as several never before seen images of that day, such as Lyndon Johnson leaving Parkland Hospital.

As a result of the donation of this film to the National Archives, the Assassination Records Review Board received a good deal of publicity from all over the United States, and the world.

**Project:** Using reference materials provided by ARRB, contact designated newspapers from around the United States, and arrange for the ARRB to acquire copies of the stories as they ran in the papers.

Call the librarian at each listed paper; tell them on whose behalf you are calling, and tell them what we need. If they are willing to just send us a copy of the paper, the address will be listed below.
