

Suggested footnote for USAF letter:

On August 16, 1994, Ssgt. Don Valentine of Andrews AFB responded to a preliminary inquiry from Dr. William Joyce, a member of the Review Board, indicating that Andrews AFB was not in possession of any records relating to the assassination. While we appreciate that response, we are now interested in determining agency compliance with all aspects of the JFK Act, particularly in light of the enclosed definition of "assassination records."

Specifically, we are interested in the following areas: flight plans and transmissions from Air Force One from November 22, 1963; records of the Strategic Air Command indicating any or all changes that day in the readiness level of the Armed Forces; message traffic or orders indicating changes in the DEFCON level on November 22, 1963; records originating from the office of Gen. Curtis LeMay from November 22, 1963, and the immediate aftermath which might discuss the assassination; records of John Edward Pic, Lee Harvey Oswald's half-brother, who served in the Air Force in the late 1950's; U-2 records and orders regarding flights or operations in the Soviet Union, China, and Japan between 1958 and 1962; and any official Air Force correspondence with government investigations of the assassination (Warren Commission, Rockefeller Commission, Church Committee, or the House Select Committee on Assassinations.).
