Thank you again for taking the time to speak with me by telephone yesterday concerning the holding of the New Orleans Public Library Archives relative to documents which may be reasonably related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. I understand that in addition to the three boxes of records on deposit from the District Attorney's office (Garrison investigation materials) the collection also houses records from the New Orleans police department relating to Lee Harvey Oswald's arrest and from the New Orleans Coroner's Office relating to the death and autopsy of David Ferrie.

I look forward to meeting you on Wednesday May 31 at 2:30 pm at your office. One of my colleagues from the Review Board may accompany me. At that time I would like to view as much of the collection as possible and further discuss the Review Board's interest in assassination related documents.

I have enclosed two items for your information. Public Law 102-526 created the John F. Kennedy Records Collection at the National Archives and the Assassination Records Review Board. The Congressional Research Service report is also helpful in understanding the legislation and the Review Board's mandate. I'm looking forward to receiving and reading the inventory of the Garrison files and your paper.
