

1. The information at issue reveals nothing about current relationships, nothing about sensitive sources and methods, and nothing that has not already been publicly acknowledged and revealed.
2. There is significant public interest in the information. It deals with a topic that has invited persistent speculation because of the incomplete record. It is precisely this kind of information that Congress wanted released to the American people.
3. The Board's action was limited and discriminating. It did not recommend a wholesale release, but rather took a reasoned step to make available important information without compromising important relationships.
