Sandy Alport (Naval Counter Intelligence Support Center): Very protective of Oswald file; States that there are a number of documents from other agencies in the file; interviews of Oswald platoon members last time she worked with the file was four or five years ago. FOIA people have used it. Jean Conover is the Senior person in the FOIA office who coordinated the retrieval of the assassination record. Apparently they just made a copy of the file and sent it to Archives I. The 30 years old original file is still with their records section (Ms. Neely).

We discussed Defectors/Deserters and there was quite a distinction between the two. She did mention that Neely will hold on to Oswald file.

Jim Mallet: Southwest Regional Office Records Person)

-Does not have records of significance on the 8th Naval District. More administrative in detail.

-He does have equipment used at Parkland Hospital (Dallas) Trauma Unit for President Kennedy.

-The filmed records of the Dallas Police Files for the city of Dallas.

Steve Tilley - Archives

- Spoke with Steve about the Naval Counter Intelligence Support Center. I mentioned that the FOIA office had sent a copy of the Oswald file to Archives I about a year ago. Apparently it was delivered to a Ron Swerczek, Chief Project Manager 2/94.

-The Army had indicated that they were ready to dump close to 10,000 assassination records (Defector Informant Files) to the Archives. It was discovered that they had not used the RIF's or the disketts. Steve informed them that they must provide the information in the form that it was requested. Estimated 12 FRC (Brown Boxes) or 30 Grey Boxes.
