The printouts offered with this report are only meager portions of the Internet community's information on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. I included not only documents, diagrams and photographs from the Internet (namely, the World Wide Web) but also included main "home" pages that display what each site has to offer. Among the pictures and printouts, one can also find many sounds and movies related to the assassination.

Numerous reports about the ARRB were posted in scattered sites around the Web. The articles printed out concerning the ARRB are offered not because they simply repeat releases and press statements, but offer somewhat of a public opinion about the ARRB. Other printouts included are a frame by frame analysis of the Zapruder film, criticisms about the "magic bullet" theory, and personal convictions on the assassinations of JFK. The World Wide Web offers an excellent media for conveying such ideas by means of *hypertext markup language*, or html. In this way pictures, text, sound and animation can be displayed on a single page and accessed world wide. In the accompanying html documents, sites originate not only within the United States, but also in Germany, the United Kingdom and Australia.

Included web pages of interest are a FAQ (answers to Frequently Asked Questions) document about the assassination, an in-depth graphical analysis of the Zapruder film, references to multimedia displays, and links to other sources of information. Probing deeper, one can easily find a searchable reference through the JFK collection of the National Archives, links to other sources, the complete Warren Commission report, rare Garrison interviews, evidence that aliens from outer space are responsible for the death of President Kennedy, and much more.
