Mexico City

Oswald's September 27 to October 1, 1963 visit to Mexico City remains another one of the nagging subplots to the assassination story that has never been explained to the satisfaction of those researching the assassination. Beyond the volumes of records contained within both Oswald's 201 file and the Sequestered Collection which pertain to Mexico, the Review Board was persistent in its search for additional records that might offer additional insight, if not explanation, of Oswald's activities there.

CIA's agreement to open up Mexico City station information covering the relevant period, paved the way for the Review Board to seek out additional records. The Review Board submitted formal and informal requests relating to electronic surveillance, Win Scott Files, Anne Goodpasture, designated as AR's information previously dismissed by CIA as NBR. As the Mexican Government also conducted an investigation into the activities of Lee Harvey Oswald, the Review Board enlisted the assistance of the State Department, to request the Mexican Government to search its files for possible records relevant to the assassination.
