To whom it may concern:

It is with pleasure and enthusiasm that I write this recommendation for Sara Farley.

I have known Sara since 1996. During the summer of 1997 she worked as as Legal Fellow on a research project I have been preparing for the Law and Religion Program at Emory Law School. I am now serving as one of her advisors for her undergraduate honors thesis at Stanford. As a basis for my evaluation of Sara, you should know that I have taught undergraduates at Harvard and that I currently supervise a staff of thirty professionals (including Ph.Ds and lawyers). During the past 10 years I have supervised, in several different offices, more than forty interns.

Sara combines three estimable qualities: intelligence, diligence, and personality. The project that we worked on this summer was one that is quite challenging, particularly for a person without a prior background in the area. We worked on legal issues involving more than a dozen countries in Central and Eastern Europe, including Russia. Sara quickly grasped the issues. She made herself conversant in a wide-range of issues and asked probing and insightful questions. She was the most diligent intern with whom I have ever worked. She tenaciously sought ought information and records from a wide variety of sources. I no of no instance where she took "no" as an answer to an inquiry. She was able to accomplish this, I believe, because of her dynamic and forthright personality. She comes across as an extremely determined -- albeit non-threatening -- person. Sara worked hard and worked intelligently.
