

Trip to Secret Service October 31, 1996

1. Jane Vezeris is still looking at files for SS-9. John Machado said they may have been looked at by HSCA. I told him that means we must look at them as well.
2. Newspaper clippings: John will forward them to NARA. After John talks to Steve, John will write to us to indicate how they are available to the public (photocopies or originals, etc.)
3. Re: address of agent: when John hears from Steve, he will contact us. Re: October 25, 1996 letter from Vezeris.
4. John said he went to LBJ Library last year and opened all USSS material. Contact Tina Houston about Box 45.
5. John Machado thinks COS material may have been converted into a J file, i.e. criminal file, and then destroyed after 20 years.
6. Any artifacts such as Ruby's clothing, picked up by Secret Service would go with the file. Ruby was not a criminal file. Any physical evidence may be in the JFK Library. We might ask Secret Service to open its materials at the JFK Library
7. I reviewed *White House: Advance Manual Detail* and selected assassination record pages
8. I reviewed *Presidential Protective Division Manual* and selected assassination record material.
9. I reviewed Personnel Logs, 1961-1962. Note names of clerks in Dallas, Chicago, New Orleans, and Chief's Office. Note increase in personnel after 1961. Security checks and checks that were "discontinued."
