

Points for Customs Meeting  
July 26, 1995 - 9:00 a.m.

- Meeting with Connie Drew and Irving Wilson
  - They said to deal with USCS directly.
  - We will be copying them on all correspondence.
  - USCS should have received correspondence from Bill Joyce in May of 1994. The only response we have is Bryant's (main Treasury) letter indicating that IRS is the only bureau with records.
  - We think that Customs also has records -- take time to read through the statutory definition and the regulatory definition included in the 6/28/95 letter to Commissioner Weise.
  
- Search for records
  - Have all components of Customs HQ been searched in light of the regulatory definition?<sup>1</sup>
  - Field Offices?
  - Federal Records Centers?
  - Who performed the search?
  - Did you issue written directives about what constituted an assassination record?
  - Request all documentation of USCS search under the JFK Act.
  
- Liaison files with WC, HSCA, Rockefeller committee, Church Committee, Pike Committee
  
- HSCA Liaison
  - 1/78 until 7/78 - HSCA wrote Customs at least 11 times; requested info on 130 individuals and 2 WC exhibits.
  - Customs wrote 2 substantive letters back: (1) they assembled a portion of the info HSCA wanted, (2) some documents at Federal Records Center in Georgia, (3) some records "misplaced."
  - The correspondence mentions a meeting b/t Customs and HSCA staffers. Any information/notes on such a meeting would be helpful.

  - 135 forms we have seen are not very informative.
  - Are there any more informative/detailed indices of what is in Federal Records Center from this time period.
    - e.g. Fort Worth, Georgia, etc...
  - Information re: destruction schedule and/or policies or procedures from 1960 to present?
  
- Liaison with other Intelligence Agencies in late 50s, early 60s.
  
- ARRB Access
  - Where are records from the late 50s and early 60s?
  - When and where can we look at them?
