SUBJECT: Edward Becker

FILE REVIEWED

In May, I reviewed and negotiated the FBI's main file on Edward Becker (HQ File No. 92-9927).

SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

The Becker file is a single volume that consists of certain 1967 memoranda that relate to the credibility of Becker's allegation that Carlos Marcello threatened President Kennedy's life in September, 1962.

MAJOR POSTPONEMENT ISSUES

The FBI has asked the Board to agree to postpone the release of the identity of an informant that discredits Becker, as well as the identities of two other individuals who provided information on Becker. Because of the high public interest in Becker's allegations, I requested the FBI to provide evidence on these informants. We have also made a request for additional information so that we can review the informant file to determine whether it contains assassination records.

SUBJECT: "Bunny" Breen, a.k.a.: Eileen Curry, Carol Conner, Carol Scott

FILE REVIEWED

In May and June, I reviewed and negotiated several FBI files related to "Bunny" Breen. These included: 31-85306, 31, 88861, 166-1237, 166-5451, and one "see" reference package.

SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

"Bunny" Breen was an associate of Jack Ruby. Her files consist of FBI investigatory documents on her criminal activities (primarily prostitution), and reports from the times when she provided information to law enforcement authorities.

MAJOR POSTPONEMENT ISSUES

All of the postponements were routine issues involving informant symbol and file numbers and names. The files have several sections that have been referred to other agencies due to *foreign government* information or *grand jury testimony*.

SUBJECT: Cuban Revolutionary Junta and Junta Cubana Revolucionaria

FILES REVIEWED

In May, I reviewed and negotiated the FBI files on the Cuban Revolutionary Junta (HQ File No. 105-200064) and Junta Cubana Revolucionaria (Cuban Revolutionary Board) (HQ File No. 105-229101). The first file consists of a small volume of material covering the activities of JURE in Miami in the 1969-1970 time period. The second file consists of one volume of material covering the activities of this anti-Castro group in 1972-1974.

SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

JURE was an anti-Castro group of Cuban exiles.

MAJOR POSTPONEMENT ISSUES

The postponements in the first file are for source names and numbers. Almost all of the postponements in the second file pertain to source names and numbers, also, but there are some postponements regarding substantive information provided by the source where the information could reasonably be expected to disclose the source, but these were kept to a minimum.
