

Chapter 7
Reflections and Recommendations
Discussion Points for Open Meeting on August 26, 1998

Introductory Section

- On page 5, Bill states that agency releases of information can assist the agencies themselves. Given that the agencies will have to realize that declassification is good for them, should this point be further explained and expanded?
- Pages 5-6 evaluate the Board's impact on various communities. Will these communities change their opinions about the Board's work over time? Will these communities actually *use* the Collection?

Reflections

- The reflection concerning an unreasonable raises the question of how to define an "end" the Review Board's efforts. At what point can an entity like the Review Board know that they have "finished?"

Recommendations

- On page 26, the chapter suggests that a Review Board "model" might make sense for other topics of high public interest. Should the chapter suggest topics as examples, as it does with regard to World War II topics?
- To what extent should Chapter 7 cross-reference other chapters in the Final Report where background information relevant to certain recommendations could be found?
- As for life-after-the-Review-Board, should Chapter 7 discuss the types of issues that need to be addressed in memoranda of understanding with DOJ, CIA, FBI, and NARA?
