Re: Your request for information concerning the film taken from Lee Harvey Oswald's camera

Dear Jamie Kramer:

The Federal Information Center sent us your September 27, 1995, Freedom of Information Act request in which you requested access to information concerning, or photographs of, or the location of the piece of concrete curb which allegedly sustained bullet damage during the assassination of President Kennedy.

Unfortunately, it is the National Archives and not our office, that holds assassination records and artifacts. I called the Chief of the JFK Assassination Records Collection at the National Archives, who assured me that he would be able to answer your inquiries about assassination artifacts. For your reference, I have included two information sheets. The first describes the JFK Collection at the National Archives. The second describes the activities of the Assassination Records Review Board.

In order to avert future delays in requests for information regarding the assassination of President Kennedy, I have contacted the Federal Information Center and advised them to direct any future inquiries regarding assassination artifacts to the JFK Collection at the National Archives and Records Administration.

I am sorry that the Federal Information Center did not forward your request directly to the Archives. However, because I am a fellow Kansan and a lawyer, I was happy to hear about your class and to facilitate your request. If you have any additional questions, please feel free to give me a call.
