D. Army Security Agency

1952 -- Armed Forces Security Agency folded into National Security Agency

1962 -- Army Intelligence Corps and Army Security Agency became the Army Intelligence and Security Branch (later U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command [INSCOM])

Prior to 1965, there were separate intelligence corps for the six armies and the Washington Military District

1971 -- NSA Chief oversees NSA and the Central Security Service ("CSS"). CSS is composed of ASA, Naval Security Group Command, and Air Force Security Service.
