Re: Interview Under the JFK Assassination Records Collection Act

Dear Ms. Higdon:

This is to confirm our conversation in which we agreed that you would be interviewed by the Assassination Records Review Board ("Review Board") in connection with your prior work for the Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities ("the Church Committee"). The date of the interview is May 27, 1998 at 10:00 a.m. at the offices of the Review Board.

As I briefly explained to you, the Review Board was created as an independent Federal agency under the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. § 2107 ("JFK Act"). The Review Board's Congressional mandate is to identify and release to the public records relating to the assassination of President Kennedy. Church Committee records are specifically referenced in the JFK Act.

The purpose of our interviewing you is to assist us in ensuring that all relevant Church Committee records have been identified and released to the public. As provided by the JFK Act, all Review Board staff members have the necessary security clearances. At this time, we are uncertain how long the interview will take.
