Dear Tina:

Thank you for making yourself available for a telephone interview on August 20 to review with Irene Marr and me the status of remaining work to be completed by the Lyndon B. Johnson Presidential Library ("LBJ Library") under the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. § 2107 ("JFK Act").

Based on our discussion, it is apparent that there are some additional assassination-related records in the custody of the LBJ Library that have not yet been transmitted to the JFK Assassination Records Collection ("JFK Collection") at the National Archives. These include certain record collections, oral histories, and Presidential recordings. It is apparent that the LBJ Library will not have completed its work under the JFK Act when it submits its Final Declaration. Therefore, we request that the LBJ Library identify specifically, in its Final Declaration of Compliance, all of the known assassination-related records at the Library that have yet to be sent to the JFK Collection, including the records described to us in our interview with you. We also ask for the LBJ Library's explicit commitment to transmit these records to the JFK Collection by September 30, 1998.

We look forward to receiving the LBJ Library's Final Declaration of Compliance. As always, please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any questions.
