Subject: Library of Congress

Enclosed for the Review Board are excerpts of the Final Declaration of Compliance of the Library of Congress submitted to us in January 1998. The Declaration identified certain collections in the Manuscript Division that contain materials relating to the Kennedy assassination.

The Library identified the following individuals whose collections are open to the public and contain material relating to the JFK assassination: (1) Elmer Gertz, Jack Ruby's attorney; (2) Chief Justice Earl Warren; (3) and CIA official David Atlee Phillips. There were also miscellaneous open records for John F. Kennedy and Robert F. Kennedy, as well as an original Oswald letter.

The Library also identified three sets of restricted records that relate to the assassination of President Kennedy: (1) Vice-President Nelson Rockefeller's set of Rockefeller Commission records, estimated to be 15 linear feet in volume (access requires permission of CIA until 2002); (2) 2 folders of Daniel Moynihan on the assassination (access requires his permission); and (3) files of Howard Liebengold, an aide to Howard Baker, in connection with his work on the Church Committee, including one folder on the JFK assassination (access requires his permission).

Attached for the Review Board are the *indices to the restricted collections only*. The complete Final Declaration and enclosures can be made available to the Board members if they wish when they are at the Review Board offices.
