Dear Chuck:

I am certain that you have concerns that are of greater importance than disputes between PFIAB and the Assassination Records Review Board. I am writing, however, to close the loop on my letter to you dated May 8, 1998, and Warren Rudman's letter to you dated May 13, 1998.

I am pleased to report that PFIAB, after further discussions and exchanges of correspondence with us, has now transferred its records to the Review Board for processing under the JFK Act. Although we wish to note officially our disagreement with some statements contained in Mr. Rudman's letter to you, the important point is that PFIAB has now complied with its responsibilities under the Act. Unless and until PFIAB chooses to appeal to the President any formal determinations by the Review Board, we do not anticipate the need of any further involvement by your office.
