Thank you for your letter to the Review Board regarding your interest in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Mr. John Tunheim, Chair of the Review Board, asked me to respond and apologize for the delay in writing to you. The Board only recently received funding to hire a staff.

I have enclosed some materials for your information. Included are the following:

1. A fact sheet on the Review Board;
2. Remarks made Mr. Tunheim at a recent conference in Washington, D.C.;
3. A recent news release on the Board's plans for early 1995; and
4. An information kit that was distributed at the Board's public hearing in Dallas on November 18, 1994.

The Review Board is committed to ensuring the broadest possible release of records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. Although it is not the Board's responsibility under the law to answer the questions that remain concerning the assassination and its aftermath, it is the Board's duty to do its best to find all of the remaining records and secure them at the National Archives so that the public has full access to them.
