My colleague, Tom Samoluk, recently told me he spoke with you and your father at the Review Board's public hearing in New Orleans on June 28. I understand your late mother, Barbara Reid, was an investigator/researcher in Jim Garrison's office and collected some six boxes of records, some or all of which may be related to Mr. Garrison's investigation and prosecution of Clay Shaw.
