It was a pleasure to speak with you by telephone about the photographs you took at Jack Ruby's Carousel Club shortly before President Kennedy's assassination. Contributions of information and assassination-related records such as the photographs you took make an invaluable contribution to the full historical record of the President's assassination. The John F. Kennedy Records Collection at the National Archives is the world's largest and best preserved collection of assassination-related records. The Collection is fully open to the public at no cost.

The negatives from the Carousel Club and the letter from Mr. Ruby are without doubt important assassination-related records. I hope you will seriously consider donating the prints of the negatives and the copy of the letter to the JFK Collection. The National Archives would provide a Deed of Gift to commemorate your donation.

For your information I've enclosed a fact sheet about the Review Board, a copy of our legislation, and a pamphlet published by the National Archives that describes the JFK Records Collection.
