Dear Mrs. Sheridan:

The Assassination Records Review Board was established by Congress and charged with the responsibility of identifying, locating, and making available all records that relate to the assassination of President Kennedy, including those in private hands.

Among the papers that your late husband had deposited with the Kennedy Library in Boston were 13 folders of material relating to the NBC White Paper on the Jim Garrison investigation. At your husband's request, these papers were removed from the Library in 1993 and returned to him. Their removal from the Library, combined with your husband's skill as an investigator and his association with the Kennedy family, have heightened the public interest in these records.

May we appeal to you to allow us to review these records to determine whether they should be included in the John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection at the National Archives? We will call you in the near future to discuss this request. In the meantime, should you have any questions or need additional information, please don't hesitate to call.
