Dear Mr. DiEugenio:

I am writing in response to your recent questions. I tried to reach you by telephone today, but did not get an answer.

1. *Lee Harvey Oswald's IRS Records.* We do not have them.
2. *Core FBI documents currently under appeal.* As it stands now, there are 53 FBI documents under appeal. This number can change easily. Documents on appeal are moving targets. We may have good news in the near future.
3. *Correspondence between Marina Porter and the Review Board.* I have attached Ms. Porter's April 19, 1996 letter to ARRB Chairman Tunheim, as well as the April 24, 1996 response from Tom Samoluk. As I am sure you understand, Ms. Porter's address had to be redacted.
4. *Obtaining copies of documents.* I will send to you the HSCA documents that you requested (Bureau of Prisons records regarding E. Howard Hunt, Gaeton Fonzi's memoranda regarding Antonio Veciana, and Fonzi's interview with Samuel G. Kail.) There is a remote possibility that James Angleton's testimony to the HSCA will be available by the end of February (the deadline you relayed to me for your article.) I will keep you posted on the availability.

I hope this information is helpful to you. Please let me know if you have any questions.
