

Dear Mr. Wilson:

I have appreciated receiving your letters on the subject of the evidence that you have developed concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. I understand how important you feel this material is, and also your reluctance to share the information. I want to assure you, again, that the Review Board is willing to have our staff review the results of your work. No disrespect is intended when I ask you to consider making an appointment and review the material with the staff of the Review Board. I have recently spoken with Deputy Director Tom Samoluk regarding this matter. If you choose to contact the Board, he will ensure that your materials are carefully reviewed and that any necessary recommendations are made to the Board. The staff is very skilled and knowledgeable and it truly is best that you work with them. The Board, by law, is a part-time board whose members meet in Washington at limited times with a long agenda. All matters considered by the Board are developed, as they should be, by the staff.

Again, while I understand your views, I do want you to consider reviewing your evidence with our staff. At that point, the Board can be advised as to whether any of your material falls within the jurisdiction of the Board. The Board's role, of course, is to locate and release to the American public records that relate in some way to the assassination.
