

David G. Marwell

David Marwell is the Executive Director of the Assassination Records Review Board. He joined the newly established Board as the first staff member in August of 1994. Since then he has hired and organized a staff of 27 and has directed the efforts of this independent federal agency charged with the responsibility of identifying, securing, and making available all records relating to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Before joining the Board, Marwell was the Director of the Berlin Document Center in Berlin, Germany. In addition to being the custodian of over 12,000 linear meters of captured Nazi party personnel-related records, he prepared the Center for transfer to the German government in July of 1994, a task that included the complete microfilming of the collection. This massive microfilming project resulted in over 55 million frames of microfilm and included the computer indexing of the records. From 1980 until 1988, Marwell worked at the Office of Special Investigations at the U.S. Department of Justice as a Senior Historian and finally as Chief of Investigative Research. He played a prominent role in the Klaus Barbie and Josef Mengele investigations. Marwell holds a B.A. from Brandeis University and a Ph.D. in Modern European History from the State University of New York at Binghamton.
