Subject: Postal Service Records

I have reviewed the records that were processed under the JFK Assassination Records Collection Act by the Postal Service. The volume consisted of less than 1 box of items. Conspicuously absent were records and reports by Postal Inspector H.D. Holmes of the Dallas Postal Inspector's office. I would like to investigate the possibility that there are records at the Suitland records storage facility which may be of interest to the ARRB.

Contained in the records at the Postal Service are several letters and memorandum authored by Chief Postal Inspector H. B. Montague. A review of the Church Commission report revealed that Montague would have had the most substantive knowledge concerning any mail cover or mail opening operations. The only mention of any such operation in the records which I reviewed dealt with the process of screening foreign communist propaganda. Oswald received a POD Form 2153x requesting Oswald's consent or refusal of the delivery of "OGNEK," a communist mailing.
