JFK Assassination Records Review Board to Transfer CIA Documents to National Archives for Public Release

Washington, DC . . . At 9 AM on Friday, July 21, 1995, the National Archives will make available to the public (16) CIA documents which the JFK Assassination Records Review Board has voted to release in full and is transferring to the Archives for inclusion in the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Record Collection.

The CIA documents which the Review Board is transferring to the National Archives relate to Lee Harvey Oswald's visit to Mexico City in the fall of 1963, only weeks before the assassination of President Kennedy, and the opening of Oswald's "201 file. These documents have been publicly available, but previously contained many redactions. The Review Board recently voted unanimously to release the records in their entirety.

Copies of the CIA documents being transferred by the Assassination Records Review Board to the National Archives will be available from the Public Affairs staff in Room G-6 of the downtown building, located etc., etc., etc.,.
