Because the volume of documents being released by the Review Board is increasing dramatically with each Board meeting, requests for documents released through the Board in the future will have to be directed to the National Archives.

Documents which we are able to supply at this time cover releases through the Review Board's September meeting.

It should be noted that federal agencies are also releasing documents directly

to the National Archives, which do not require review by the Review Board.
