Dear Ms. Buras:

Thank you for returning my call today to discuss records related to the assassination of President Kennedy.

Per our conversation, I am enclosing a copy of The President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992 (PL 102-526) and some additional explanatory information.

As I mentioned to you on the telephone, the Review Board has a public hearing scheduled for Wednesday, June 28, 1995, at 10:00 a.m. in the auditorium of the Old U.S. Mint building in New Orleans. The Review Board would like to formally extend an invitation to District Attorney Connick to testify at this hearing. We would anticipate that his testimony

would focus on records from the Garrison investigation and the Clay Shaw trial. District Attorney Connick's presence and testimony at the hearing would be welcomed and appreciated by the Board.

The goal of the public hearing is to gather testimony regarding the existence and location of assassination records in the New Orleans area. As I emphasized on the telephone, the Board's mandate is to find records and make them available to the American public, not to reinvestigate the assassination or make judgment about prior investigations.

This letter will be followed by a telephone call to further discuss the scheduling of a visit to your office by Board staff members at a convenient time for the review of relevant files, prior to the public hearing on June 28th.
