**1. Status on the Records**

- a. We would like to come look at when we are there
- b. HSCA looked at everything but grand jury; they copied a limited number of things
- c. I have paper on what HSCA did and can fax that to you
- d. They were going to be destroyed at that time
- e. We think because the HSCA reviewed the records, the law applies

**2. Connick testifying**

- a. We are cooperating with the Board and have given access to files
- b. This is what we have in our files
- c. It is important to preserve the records for history (regardless of his feelings about Garrison and what better way to "expose" the investigation than to make his records available

**3. Buras testifying in lieu of Connick, if simply matter of scheduling**

4. **Connick letter** "to coordinate the identification and release of records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy"... "Please contact me or Ms. Buras as soon as you determine the date when a member of your staff will be in New Orleans to review our files of the Garrison investigation and of Clay Shaw's trial."

5. **Zully Jiminez** representation on two occasions that the D.A. was going to testify, and no indication contrary to that when I sent her a letter confirming that he would testify.

**6. Have to get out media advisory; need to know if he is going to testify**

- a. There will be press inquiries about the D.A. and Garrison files that remain there; want to say positive things
