I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to testify at a public hearing of the Assassination Records Review Board on Wednesday, May 17, 1995 at the [XXX LOCATION] in Washington, D.C. The public hearing will start at 10:00 a.m.

As a sponsor of the original legislation, I know you are aware that the Review Board was created by The President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992 to oversee the review and release of records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. As part of the Board's effort to fulfill its mandate, we are seeking advice and guidance from individuals involved in the two major federal investigations of the assassination, conducted by the Warren Commission and House Select Committee on Assassinations. The Board believes that you and the other individuals from whom we are seeking testimony have a unique perspective on the existence and location of assassination records that should be included in the collection of assassination records at the National Archives. Your testimony would add greatly to the hearing on May 17th and to the body of testimony that the Board has already gathered through several public meetings and hearings in Washington, Dallas, and Boston.
