Thank you for your letter of March 21, 1995 to Mr. Tunheim. He has asked me to respond to you.

Please be assured that the Review Board is committed to ensuring the broadest possible release of records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Although it is not our responsibility under the law to answer the questions that remain concerning the assassination and its aftermath, it is our duty to do our best to find all of the remaining records and secure them at the National Archives so that the public has full access to them.

In response to your question regarding some specific records, the Review Board has not actually begun the review of CIA and FBI records yet. That process will begin later this spring.

Again, thank you for taking the time to write and offer us your

thoughts. Your name will be added to our mailing list to keep you apprised of the Review Board's work.
